



NEW DUES STRUCTURE FOR NEW MEMBER CANDIDATES

A new dues structure for proposed new members to our club has been approved by your Board of Directors. It was necessitated due to the billing cycles of the International, our multiple, and our district that caused an unfair and unnecessary expense to our new members. For example, the district bills the club for all current members in July. After that time, there is no further benefit that a new member need to pay for since the new member now is covered by the club.

As a result, when you need to divulge what the initiation fee and dues will cost the new member or members, please refer to this new dues structure. Please note the one-time initiation fee is \$35.00 per person no matter when they join. It's the month they join in that will determine their dues for the remainder of the year. Please also note that we send out our dues notices starting in April. The reason for this is to remove from the membership roll (drop) anyone who has not paid by June 15th. This way we will not be billed by the entities beyond our club on June 30th. Once we are billed, we cannot seek any refunds.

The "Magic" of Compound Interest

Back in the 1950s, our Lions district started a fund, formerly known as the Blind and Charity Fund, as an investment vehicle to provide an ongoing stream of money that would be used for funding the Buffalo Eye Bank and for clubs for their charitable works. Numerous clubs signed on board with the program, funding it at a rate of \$200.00 a share with a maximum purchase of ten shares. Our club signed up with a \$1,000 infusion of money, allowing us five shares in the fund. Every year, the dividends were divided up amongst the clubs holding shares. In the unfortunate event of a club folding, their share balance would then be divided up amongst the remaining clubs.


In 2013, the entire fund was turned over to the renowned Community Foundation for Greater Buffalo to handle all the investing and distribution of funds. As part of the transfer of funds, one-half of all distributions would be earmarked for Upstate New York Transplant Services (UNYTS), formerly known as the Buffalo Eye Bank, which was founded by seven Lions clubs in 1949.

Although historical data is missing on our returns of investment, or ROI for our Lion stock market followers, it can be safely estimated that we have received at least 58 years of returns on our original \$1,000 investment. The past two years alone has seen our Welfare Fund realize over \$2,700 from that very wise decision of our Lions predecessors. This year could see the total climb to over \$4,000. Thanks to compound interest and the wisdom of all those involved in that decision a long time ago!
