We've got some exciting news – the Clothing Collection Shed has finally opened at the Grand Island High School, thanks to Lion Donna Lavallee's outstanding leadership. It's not just a small fundraiser for us, but an amazing environmental project that will help reduce the amount of clothing ending up in our local landfills. Lion Donna has some great advertisement posters that we can place in businesses. If you know of a place that could help us get the word out, please let us know.

The board has suggested a \$5.00 dues increase for the 2025-26 year to cover the State Dues increase approved at the last State Convention. So, our next year's dues would go up from \$80.00 to \$85.00. We will have more information about this when the budget for the year is complete.

Lion Tom Witkowski and his committee is working on the budgets for the Charity and Admin Funds for next year. That will be published to all the members when the board makes it's final approval in September.


VOLUNTEER INSTRUCTIONS
