The Erie County Sheriff's Office responded to 348 calls the week of this report. Below is a sampling of the noteworthy incidents in **Grand Island**.

Date	Type	Street	Narrative
12/12	UUMV	Love Rd.	Deputies responded to a report that a person left their vehicle unlocked and running while they went inside a business and the vehicle was stolen. Deputies canvassed the area and recovered video of the incident. Ongoing investigation.
12/13	UUMV Attempt – Criminal Mischief	E. Park Rd. area	Deputies received a call from two separate owners stating that there was damage to their vehicle's consistent with attempted UUMV. Incident investigated and police reports were completed.
12/14	UUMV - Arrest	Bedell Rd.	Deputies were notified of a stolen vehicle. A short time later the vehicle was located occupied by four subjects. The subjects were all charged with criminal possession of stolen property.
12/14	UUMV	Blue Pointe Lane	Deputies responded to a report of a vehicle stolen. The owner reported finding the vehicle handle broken off and vehicle gone from the driveway. Report completed. Ongoing investigation.
12/16	DWI - Alcohol	Huth Rd.	Deputies initiated a traffic stop for observed traffic infraction(s). The driver was arrested, processed, and registered a BAC of .15, almost twice the legal limit. Subject turned over to a sober third party and the vehicle was placed under a twelve-hour hold.
12/17	Animal Bite	Bedell Rd.	Deputies were called for a report of a subject bit by a dog. Subject was putting dog back in crate and it bit the subjects calf and forearm. Subject transported to the hospital for further care. Police report and a referral to the Dog Control Officer.
